Head Start: Comprehensive pre-school program targeting eligible families with 3-5 year-old children.

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Medication Assistance Program (MAP)

Developed to assist lower income individuals in finding free to low cost medication.



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Medication Assistance Program (MAP)

The Medication Assistance Program (MAP) was developed to assist lower income individuals with no prescription coverage in finding and applying for free to low-cost medication programs offered by existing pharmaceutical companies. The program does not pay for any medications, reimburse for past medical expenses, or dispense medications, we act as a link between the patient and the pharmaceutical company.

There is a \$30 quarterly fee for this program. The fee is due to a cut in grant funding and helps pay for staff time, phone calls, postage, paper, etc. The average cost of household prescriptions are around \$250.00 a month.

The process of getting medications can take anywhere from 6-8 weeks from the time the applications are sent to the company.



There are no age requirements for the Medication Assistance Program. The only requirements are no prescription coverage and you must meet the income guidelines.

Do I qualify?

The pharmaceutical companies generally go by the following guidelines:

- \$19,000.00 for a single individual
- \$30,000.00 for a couple



Each of the 180 pharmaceutical companies we work with have their own guidelines-some greater then the above amounts and some less than the above amounts.

How do I apply?

You can apply for MAP by calling Community Action Partnership for an application and applications are also available at the front desk of Dickinson Clinic and Great Plains Clinic. All applications must be returned to Community Action Partnership (ACP). The following is the information you must return with your request so your application can be processed:

- Completed CAP intake form (will be attached to application)

- List of current medications (attached to application)
- Signed contract and \$30 quarterly fee
- Copy of Insurance Card, Medicare Card or Medicare Supplement Card (if Applicable)
- Verification of all HOUSEHOLD income (earned & unearned) to include first two pages of most current tax return, current pay stubs, and social security benefits page, whichever is applicable.

Appointments are needed to meet with the Medication Assistance Specialist.

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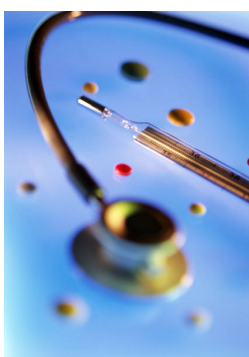


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
