BASIC JUVENILE COURT PROCEDURES

Juvenile Court receives referrals from law enforcement, schools, social services and parents regarding deprived, unruly and delinquent children. The Juvenile Court Supervisor reviews the referrals and determines the appropriate process needed for each case. This process may include diversion to another agency.

Deprivation cases involving abuse and neglect of children are processed in formal court proceedings presided over by a referee or district court judge.

A large majority of minor offenses are handled at an informal hearing with a Court Officer. Upon admission of the offense, a Court Officer may warn the child, refer the child for counseling, evaluation or programs, and may place the child on probation. These options are intended to deter the child from future law violations.

If the child denies the offense or the offense is of a more serious nature, the case is referred to the state's attorney. This can result in a formal petition and hearing before a district court judge. The dispositions in a formal hearing can include formal probation, custody to Social Services or Division of Juvenile Services with foster care placement or other placement as allowed by ND law. A secure placement such as the Youth Correction Center may be used when a juvenile is under the custody of Division of Juvenile Services.

Child and parents have the right to be represented by legal counsel at all juvenile proceedings.

WARNING SIGNS of ALCOHOL or OTHER DRUG ABUSE*

1. Change in school grades or school behavior.
2. Blaming others - not accepting responsibility of their actions.
3. Increase in physical aggression and verbal confrontation.
4. Associating with high-risk peer group (smoking, drinking, drugging, and sexually acting out.)
5. Change in sleeping/eating habits.
6. Lack of respect for adult authority - i.e. - teachers, parents, law enforcement.
7. Too secretive or boastful of their activities.
8. Unable to set goals and follow through toward success.
9. Dishonest when confronted about activities.
10. Self-mutilation in any form - i.e. - cutting on self, burning self, tattooing, threatening suicide.
11. Lack of remorse.
12. Change of long time friends.

WHO IS AN AT-RISK CHILD?

Children become at-risk whenever overwhelming negative events occur in their lives. Some of these areas are:

1. Death of a loved one including accidental death or suicide, especially if that person was an immediate family member or living in the household.
2. Severe physical illness of family members or close friends.
3. Divorce or separation.
4. Geographic change in environment whereby child is uprooted and finds him/herself in a new school, community, etc.
5. Loss of family property due to an act of nature, fire, etc.
6. Child who is a victim of or a witness to any sort of abuses (physical, emotional, sexual.)
7. Children whose parents are actively using drugs and drugs may pose a significant problem to children living in the home. It is important to remember that children need reassurance, consistency and warmth in their home environment if they are to be nurtured. Parents who use drugs and alcohol often times are inconsistent, unpredictable, irresponsible and not aware of the fears they instill in their offspring.
